

Assembly Bill 218, crafted by students from the UNLV Boyd School of Law, would provide the Commission with the authority to require governmental entities becoming involved in gaming to file whatever applications the Commission deems appropriate.

Senate Bill 372 would amend the Nevada Clean Indoor Act that currently prohibits smoking in most public businesses. The bill, that would relax the smoking ban, passed out of the Senate Judiciary Committee. The bill is waiting for a vote of the full Senate. If passed, it would not go into effect until December 9, 2009, three years after it became law that was the result of an initiative petition.

Assembly Bill 388 passed out of the Assembly Judiciary Committee. It would lower minimum slot machine wagers in gaming salons from \$500 to \$50 and limit salons to five slot machines. Other provisions in the bill pertain to sports pools, off-track pari-mutuel wagering on dog races, and wagering on other events.

Assembly Bill 476 pertains to gaming enterprise districts and would expand the boundaries of the Las Vegas Boulevard gaming corridor. This would allow two parcels to be eligible for nonrestricted gaming ventures. If passed, the expansion would become effective on October 1st.

Senate Bill 83 is the Board's multi-element bill, which was passed in its entirety out of the Senate, and, as of April 16th, was on the Assembly side. The bill would amend a number of areas in the Gaming Control Act, inclusive of provisions relating to patron disputes, continuing standards requirements, confidential and privileged records
