Frank J. Fahrenkopf, Jr., was for two decades the President & CEO of the American Gaming Association (AGA). In his role as the chief executive of the AGA, Fahrenkopf was the national advocate for the commercial casino industry and was responsible for positioning the association to address regulatory, political and educational issues affecting the industry. A lawyer by profession, Fahrenkopf gained prominence during the 1980s, when he served as chairman of the Republican Party during the presidency of Ronald Reagan.



Robert D. Faiss, a shareholder in the Nevada law firm Lionel Sawyer & Collins, is considered one of the world's foremost authorities on gaming law. He was named as the premier gaming attorney in the United States and one of the 100 Most Influential Lawyers in America by the National Law Journal. He has been an adjunct professor in gaming law and policy since 2001 at the William S. Boyd School of Law at UNLV.
